Accommodations in Higher Education under the Americans ...

Higher education institutions are required by law to make adjustments or modifications for certain classes or activities, to accommodate a student's disability. These adjustments are known as "reasonable accommodations.". The purpose of reasonable accommodations is to provide students with disabilities the equal opportunity to perform, while not placing an overly heavy burden on the school to provide the accommodation.

Reasonable accommodations are modifications or adjustments to the tasks, environment or to the way things are usually done that enable individuals with disabilities to have an equal opportunity to participate in an academic program or a job (U.S. Department of Education, 2007). Broad categories of accommodations include changes to the application process to ensure an equal opportunity to apply for program enrollment, changes that enable a student with a disability to perform the essential ...

Reasonable accommodations explained

Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act ("Title II") and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 ("Section 504") prohibit colleges, universities, and postsecondary education institutions from discriminating against students on the basis of their disabilities. While Title II's reach extends only to State and local government activities, which includes public colleges, universities, and graduate schools, section 504 covers all programs receiving Federal financial ...

Higher Education's Obligations Under Section 504 And The ...

Formal Public School Accommodations. If a candidate previously received testing accommodations under an Individualized Education Program (IEP)³ or a Section 504 Plan,⁴ he or she should generally receive the same testing accommodations for a current standardized exam or high-stakes test.

Common Accommodations in Higher Education The purpose of academic accommodations is to provide an equal opportunity to learn by ensuring access to the learning environment and course content. Accommodations are not designed to provide an unfair advantage or to ensure success.

Common Accommodations in Higher Education

An accommodation is a legally mandated modification or service that gives a student with a disability an equal opportunity to benefit from the educational process. It may be useful to think of accommodations as adjustments to how things are normally done. From one perspective, accommodations can be grouped into the following categories:

Facts on the ADA, Disability, and Accommodations ...

Accommodations are individualized and intended to respond to specific contexts and individual circumstances. 15 Though there are an many different kinds of accommodations, the most common instructional accommodations in postsecondary education for students with learning disabilities include: specialized tutoring, recorded/audiobooks, class notetakers, preferential seating, and lecture notes or study guides to prepare for exams. 18

Examples of Auxiliary Aids - US Department of Education

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Under Title III of the ADA, programs have a lower burden. In other words, assuming their resources are fewer, they wouldn't have to provide the same level of modification as programs accepting federal funds. Private postsecondary institutions are still required to provide accommodations to students with disabilities under either law.

The ADA, Section 504 & Postsecondary Education

The College seeks to assure access by providing accommodations to individuals with a disability as defined under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and the ADA Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA). Accommodation is the provision of aids, or modification to testing, services or a program of study, that allows access by individuals with disabilities.
