Captain Fabian Gottlieb von Bellingshausen was put in charge of the mission. The first Russian Antarctic expedition began in July 1819. Two ships - Vostok, under the command of Fabian Bellingshausen, and Mirny, under the command of Mikhail Lazarev, - set sail from Kronstadt (a Russian port city) and headed for the Southern Ocean.
