### The Bird Beak Challenge - Inventors of Tomorrow

The pliers worked great for the pistachios, because like the Macaw and other birds of its type, it has a hard strong beak that can crush the nut shell and eat the softer nut inside. Chopsticks, tweezers, and scissors can all grab similar types of foods, but the scissors worked best for gummy worms according to the kids.

### Bird beak experiment for kids - Adventures in Mommydom

Lesson Steps and Activities: (35-40 minutes) 1. Bird beak types (5 minutes) Discuss what kinds of beaks have you seen (long, pointy, short, wide). Explain that bird beaks are adapted to match the type of food they eat. Explain what adapted means. Many birds have tweezers-like beaks so they can reach and eat animals that burrow deep. Paint egg cup or styrofoam ball. Let dry. Glue the pom pom or styrofoam ball onto the top of the egg cup. Glue feathers onto the back of the egg cup. Glue two wiggly eyes onto the pom pom or styrofoam ball. Cut a one-1/2 inch piece of pipe cleaner and bend it in half. Glue this onto the bird's head for an open beak.

Lessons on the Lake - Activity: Bird Beak Buffet A bird's beak is basically a lightweight, bony elongation of its skull. The beak is covered with skin that produces keratin, the same material found in human fingernails and hair. On most birds, the keratin condenses and dries, forming the beak's hard, glossy, outer covering.
