There was no statutory basis for systematic legal control of CCTV surveillance over public areas until 1 March 2000, when the Data Protection Act came into force. The definitions in this new Act were broader than those of the Data Protection Act 1984 and more readily covered the processing of images of individuals caught by CCTV cameras than did the previous data protection legislation.
