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Euthanasia And The Right To

Perhaps the most pressing ethical medical dilemma concerns whether an individual has the right to die. Euthanasia, or mercy killing, means the deliberate killing of a patient who is terminally ill and/or in severe and chronic pain. More recently, "physician-assisted suicide" has superseded the term euthanasia as terminally ill patients take more assertive roles in expressing their wishes and requesting physician support.

Euthanasia: The Right to Die?

Basically, Euthanasia is a practice in which life can be put to an end intentionally to relieve the person from suffering and pain. To define Euthanasia in law terms, it means death at will or mercy killing. Difference between Suicide and Euthanasia. There is a conceptual distinction between suicide and euthanasia.

Active euthanasia is where somebody is effectively killed - they may, for instance, be given an overdose of morphine. Passive euthanasia is where a person dies because the medicine or treatment that is keeping them alive is withdrawn or stopped. Religious attitudes towards the question of should people have the right to die vary.

Euthanasia involves a physician taking an active role in ending a patient's life whereas in assisted suicide, the doctor provides a lethal substance for the patient to self-administer.

Reflecting the religious and cultural diversity of the United States, there is a wide range of public opinion about euthanasia and the right-to-die movement in the United States. And then there is the very controversial active voluntary euthanasia. This practice is when terminally ill patients, with the aid of a doctor, speed up the inevitable dying process. This practice is debated over whether it is justified through a person's right to life, and within this right, the right to end that life with dignity.

Citing Gaudium et spes, the document reiterates that "abortion, euthanasia and wilful self-destruction poison human society" and "are a supreme dishonor to the Creator" (no. 27).

It is a definitive teaching that euthanasia represents "a crime against human life", and, therefore, is "intrinsically evil" in every circumstance. Any "formal or immediate material cooperation" constitutes a grave sin against human life that no authority can "legitimately recommend or permit".

If the right to euthanasia on request were genuine, and a doctor was permitted to take the life of a patient who asked for it, the doctor would also be justified, and perhaps obliged out of compassion, in taking the lives of others in similar unfortunate circumstances. This may apply especially when, for any reason, patients could not ask.
