For pilots, Federal Aviation Regulations are classified according to the type of flying being performed and the type of aircraft flown. Pilots seeking to fly commercially will need to adhere to higher safety standards and training. FAR Part 141 - contains the regulations regarding the standards for private and commercial pilot training.

(b) A student pilot may not act as a required pilot flight crewmember on any aircraft for which more than one pilot is required by the type certificate of the aircraft or regulations under which the flight is conducted, except when receiving flight training from an authorized instructor on board an airship, and no person other than a required flight crewmember is carried on the aircraft.

U.S.-registered civil aircraft are required to comply with FAR Part 91. When over the high seas, they must comply with Annex 2 (Rules of the Air) to the Convention on International Civil Aviation. (2) FAR Part 91 prohibits a pilot from operating a civil aircraft unless it is in an airworthy condition.
