In Galatians 3:15-25, Paul is showing how the Law serves God's purposes. The Law doesn't void what God promised through Abraham, the promise that salvation would come not through our own efforts but through his very offspring. The Law serves this promise. It doesn't compete with it (vs. 19).

Children of God. 23 Before the coming of this faith,[j] we were held in custody under the law, locked up until the faith that was to come would be revealed. 24 So the law was our guardian until Christ came that we might be justified by faith. 25 Now that this faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian.

Paul provides five arguments to the effect that faith, not law, is the key to justification. He argues from (1) receiving the Spirit, (2) from Abraham, (3) from the curse of the law, (4) from the nature of a covenant, and (5) from the purpose of the law.

4. Faith Is the Key, not Law (Galatians 3:1-25). Galatians ...

Galatians 3:15. ἄδελφοί, κατὰ ἄνθρωπον λέγω —“Brethren, I speak after the manner of men”—I am going to use a human analogy, or to propose an illustration from a human point of view. “Brethren, yet beloved and cared for,” though they are censured as senseless in their relapse; affectionate remembrance naturally springing up at this pause in the argument.
