For patients aged 65 and older, the decision to perform HIV screening should be based on a patient's risk or as clinically indicated. Medicare now reimburses HIV testing (see the American Medical Association and American Academy of HIV Medicine's CPT Coding Guide for Routine HIV Testing in Health Care Settings).

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Initiating PrEP in AYA significantly reduces the negative health outcomes of HIV, but it is evident that many clinicians are still reluctant to initiate PrEP in AYA patients based on perceived threats and barriers. Context: Primary care clinics, including school-based clinics, have an opportunity to offer HIV prevention services including PrEP.
