In spring, the first leaf buds appear. In summer the tree is thick with green leaves. A substance called chlorophyll colors the leaves green and helps the plant make food. During fall and winter, it is darker and the trees can't make as much food.

The red maple tree (*Acer rubrum*) lives an average of 130 years but may survive as long as 300 years. The silver maple (*A. saccharinum*) lives an average of 100 years, sometimes stretching to 125.
