Neurological observations collect data on the patient's neurological status and can be used for many reasons, including in order to help with diagnosis, as a baseline observation, following a neurosurgical procedure, and following trauma.

Definitions Neurological observations are those investigations and examination that relate to the assessment of the nervous system. These commonly focus upon six key areas: Level of consciousness Pupillary activity Motor function Sensory function FAST (stroke recognition) Vital signs.
