QUINTILIAN AND ROMAN LAW

Quintilian was born in Calagurris (Tarraconensis) in Hispania (Spain) in about AD 35. His father sent him to Rome to study rhetoric early in the reign of Emperor Nero. He became an advocate before moving back to Spain where he practiced law. In AD 68 Quintilian returned to Rome where he worked for Emperor Galba.
