Especially for the later Berger, legitimation is a matter of social cohesion (Turner, 2008: 496), but from a critical perspective, legitimation is a struggle for hegemony. In this sense religion, as expressed by Berger, is an example of ideology, or 'meaning in the service of power', as discussed above: alternative constructions of reality are suppressed by reference to an ultimate, unquestionable source - the sacred.

The relationship between religion and social cohesion is deeply contextual and constantly evolving. Religion is a social arena that is highly interactive in relationship to other social cleavages.
