Experimental Research Methods The simple experiment is one of the most basic methods of determining if there is a cause-and-effect relationship between two variables. A simple experiment utilizes a control group of participants who receive no treatment and an experimental group of participants who receive the treatment.

For this type of research, the measurements are usually arbitrary, following the ordinal or interval type. Questionnaires are an effective way of quantifying data from a sample group, and testing emotions or preferences.

Quota sampling: In Quota sampling, the selection of members in this sampling technique happens based on a pre-set standard. People who take part in research involving experiments might be asked to complete various tests to measure their cognitive abilities (e.g. word recall, attention, concentration, reasoning ability etc.) usually verbally, on paper or by computer. The results of different groups are then compared.

Ethnographic research is probably the most in-depth observational method that studies people in their naturally occurring environment. This technique requires the researcher to immerse themselves in the target participants' environment, which may be anywhere from an organization to a geographical location.

### 6 Types of Qualitative Research Methods: A Quick Guide

In a study with a sequential design, a researcher might enroll three separate groups of children (Groups A, B, and C). Children in Group A would be enrolled when they are 2 years old and would be tested again when they are 4 and 6 years old (similar in design to the longitudinal study described previously).
