Pain is the main symptom of soft tissue rheumatic syndromes. Because the structures affected are located near the joint, moving the joint can be extremely painful and may be extremely difficult. Some conditions may cause redness, warmth, or swelling in the affected area.

Soft tissue rheumatism: Is the aggregate of clinical problems related to tendons, ligaments, fascia and bursae. They often present as a regional problem. They are quite common and compose 25% of a rheumatology practice. Regional rheumatic disorders: Brings together all problems that present with localized pain. In addition to tendons, ligaments, fascia and bursae, it includes arthritis, bone disease.

Rheumatic pain arising in tissues other than the joints is called soft tissue or non-articular rheumatism. At the same time it should be remembered that inflammation of a tendon (tenosynovitis) well away from a joint may be the first sign of rheumatoid arthritis, that is, arthritis may start with non-articular symptoms.
