Team level barriers to initiating palliative care may include diverging opinions among team members, group norms in favor of curative treatments, lack of guidelines for initiating palliative care, ambiguity about which team members should begin the discussion, and hierarchical barriers.[11,12] While communication training helps individual clinicians discuss difficult topics with patients and family members[13,14], most existing interventions do not address potential team-level barriers.

The codesign of an interdisciplinary team-based ...

A team with positive group dynamics tend to have team members who trust each other. They can work towards collective decisions and they are held accountable for outcomes. A team with good group dynamics may be constructive and productive, and it may demonstrate mutual understanding and self-corrective behaviour.

Primary palliative care is provided by community nurses and general practitioners, often in collaboration with palliative home care team nurses. Although these professionals may each individually be part of a fixed team, a new temporary team is often composed for every new palliative patient. The Center to Advance Palliative Care (CAPC) and the Social Work Hospice and Palliative Care Network (SWHPN) gathered a dozen palliative care social workers to explore challenges with their role on palliative care teams. Many argue that the role of the palliative care social worker is particularly critical in community settings, where improving quality of life for patients depends on care coordination and navigating patient/family/provider dynamics.
