The sociology of language is the study of the relationship between language and society. It 'focuses upon the entire gamut of topics related to the social organization of language behavior, including not only language usage per se but also language attitudes and overt behaviors toward language and toward language users' (Fishman, 1971, p. 217).

Sociology of language, in contrast, is the study of the relations between language and society. Although both these fields study the interaction between language and society, sociolinguistics focuses on language while sociology of language focuses on

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society. In general, sociolinguistics looks at how social factors affect language whereas the sociology of language looks at the relationship between society and language.
