Five Strategies for Explaining Death to an Autistic child

When talking about death, use simple, clear words. To break the news that someone has died, approach your child

in a caring way. Use words that are simple and direct. For example, "I have some sad news to tell you. Grandma died today." Pause to give your child a moment to take in your words. Listen and comfort.
