There are three ways to propagate a plant: dividing (separating an already growing plant into two), rooting a leaf (typically done with succulents), or rooting a cutting (a small stem with leaves). While 100% success is unlikely, geranium plant cuttings take root very well and don't need any herbicide or fungicide. Simply stick your cutting in a pot of warm, damp, sterile potting soil. Water thoroughly and place the pot in a bright location out of direct sunlight. Don't cover the pot, as geranium plant cuttings are prone to rotting.

Species vary in the amount of moisture needed to prompt germination. For example, the cucurbits (e.g., melons and cucumber) and cole crops (e.g., cabbage and broccoli) will germinate in soil with relatively low moisture content, whereas celery requires soil to be well hydrated before seeds will germinate.

Before collecting any plant material for cuttings the following need to be taken into consideration. Use clean tools and equipment during propagation (including surfaces). High standards of hygiene are important for success. Collect material early in the day when full of water (turgid) to avoid wilting.

Propagation techniques / RHS Gardening

Division in spring or summer is the best type of calathea propagation method. Keep in mind, dividing the plant will change the full appearance you've worked for. If your plant is big enough, it will spread and produce clumps to the sides that can be removed and grown out. Water a few days before you anticipate dividing and repotting the plant.

Use a good quality seed raising or propagation mix. These are especially formulated to have the right balance of water holding and air flow, and to allow roots to easily penetrate between light particles. Keep secateurs sharp and clean. Wipe blades down with tea tree oil between uses, or if going from plant to plant to take cuttings.
