Good extended-response answers have three parts: a beginning, a middle, and an ending. Beginning. The first paragraph introduces your main idea or position. It begins with a topic sentence. The topic sentence states plainly the point you intend to make in your answer. Often it simply restates the question. Middle

How to Answer Extended-Response or Essay Questions

Extended Response Prompt: Analyze the arguments presented in the two journal articles. In your response, develop an argument in which you explain how one position is better supported than the other. Incorporate relevant and specific evidence from both sources to support your argument.

Your Extended Response paragraph should follow the same paragraph structure as an analytical essay body paragraph. Parts of a good body paragraph: 1. Topic sentence: The very first sentence that clearly states what you are going to be arguing in the paragraph. 2.

Extended response questions often require 3 or more points to be made, and each point should have its own paragraph each with its own structure. Steps to Writing an "EXCELLENT" Extended Response

Be sure to plan your response before you begin writing. Draft your response and revise it as needed. 2. Fully answering an ER prompt often requires 4 to 7 paragraphs of 3 to 7 sentences each - that can quickly add up to 300 to 500 words of writing! A response that is significantly shorter could put you in danger of scoring a 0 just for not showing enough of your writing skills. 3.

As of early 2014, most American students are not accustomed to writing extended responses for assessment questions. Rarely do state assessments (and even more rarely commercial publishers' norm-referenced tests) require students to write even a phrase or a sentence or two in response to questions, much less an entire paragraph.
